Carole Mikita has worked for KSL-TV News since June 1979 as an anchor and reporter. Carole retired five years ago and now works part-time as a senior correspondent in KSL –TV special projects, focusing on religion and arts stories and specials.

Since 1998, she has created nearly 50 hour-long or half-hour documentaries about leaders and members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
